The final examination in practice – core – courses shall be conducted at the end of the session. The total days of the examination shall not be more than 5 days with 5 hours each day. The instructions have been sent by the teacher concerned thought the proper channel to the examiner in core courses.

For elective courses the detailed instructions and the nature of assignment would be sent by the teacher concerned to the examiner through proper channel.

The duration of the examination shall be separately decided by the Head of Department in consultation with the examiner on the basis of the above instructions.

Maximum time should not exceed 5 (five) days with 5 hours per day.
